**Locating in Edgewater, Incertec Florida Will Be The Largest
Aerospace Metal Finishing Service Center in the Southeast**

Daytona Beach, Florida, May 6, 2026 – Founded in 1993, as Spec Plating, in Fridley Minnesota, Incertec rebranded in 2011 to emphasize its focus on innovation, certification, and technical expertise. Now headquartered in Minneapolis, MN, Incertec is expanding to add Florida operations, with a new location in Edgewater.

“With the addition of Incertec Florida in Edgewater, we will be the best option of metal finishing for any Aerospace company,” said Rob Clark, President and CEO of Incertec.

Locating at the intersection of U.S. 1 and Relocation Road, Incertec will completely remodel a 33,000-square-foot building, which is scheduled for completion in March 2026, followed by a 56,000-square-foot expansion set to finish in August 2026. These upgrades will greatly increase capacity, enhance workflow efficiencies, and strengthen Incertec’s ability to meet the stringent requirements of its primary — and undisclosed — customers in these industries.

“This project reflects the kind of growth we want to see in Edgewater—well-planned, collaborative, and aligned with our infrastructure and long-term vision,” said Joe Mahoney, Edgewater City Manager. “Working alongside our regional partners, we were able to address key challenges and support a project that brings quality jobs and investment to our community.”

“Beginning in April of 2025, Team Volusia EDC worked with Incertec on the site selection process, including county and municipal items,” said Keith Norden, president and CEO, Team Volusia EDC. “We are excited to welcome Incertec to Edgewater and Volusia County, as our location best serves their aerospace and defense focus given Volusia County’s strategic location on the northern point of the Space Triangle.”

Together with a projected capital investment of \$16 million, Incertec will be adding 120 high paying jobs with an average wage of \$60,000.

“Seeing the Artemis II launch was one of the most inspiring things I have ever seen,” said John Scott, Economic Development Manager, City of Edgewater. “As the next space race gets ready to take off, companies like Incertec are going to play a major role in making sure Edgewater is right in the middle of all this historic action.”

“Incertec’s decision to locate in Edgewater reflects the continued economic advancement we’re seeing across Volusia County as we attract companies bringing new jobs and investment to our communities,” said George Recktenwald, Volusia County Manager. “It adds to the diverse mix of industries choosing Volusia County and highlights our ongoing emergence as a hub for advanced manufacturing.”
